Imdadul Haque, signed the agreement. Meanwhile, the Dean of the Faculty of Life and Earth Sciences, the Dean of social sciences of JnU, registrar, proctor, the Dean of Archeology Faculty of BUET, the Dean of the Faculty of Chemical and Material Technology, Dean of the Faculty of Electrical and Electronic Technology, Dean of Science Faculty, Dean of the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, registrar, Director of Rise were present. Under this agreement, teachers, researchers, and students of physical science, chemical science, biology, environmental and geological sciences of BUET and Jagannath University will implement research projects; exchange of technical and scientific information; exchange of journals; Organization of various scientific and technical seminars, symposiums and conferences in joint ventures; Joint supervision of post-graduate, M.Phil and Ph.D. degrees of researchers and students in the field of higher research; Access to state-of-the-art laboratories for resource persons, researchers, and students of both institutions; Regular visits between researchers at BUET and Jagannath University; Patents processing of results obtained through joint publications and joint projects, and any cooperation to achieve common objectives. The MoU will initially be valid for five years.
