Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs)

The MA in English Language Teaching programme at Institute of Modern Languages aims to:

- 1. Prepare students as efficient English language instructors for primary, secondary and tertiary level of education

- 7. Equip students with the skill of conducting educational research so that they can conduct research works independently, work for research institutes and be benefited while pursuing higher degrees
- 8. Provide learners with the knowledge of literature and the pedagogical skills of using literature in the language classroom so that they can bring innovation in language teaching, and at the same time can effectively implement textbooks that contain literary content
- 9. Equip learners with management and communication skills that will not be limited to the classroom, rather will enable them to succeed in professional career in government, non-government and corporate sectors
- 10. Orient learners to lifelong learning so that they keep on evaluating their own performance and update their knowledge and skills to cope-up with the ever-changing pedagogical scenarios

- 6. Develop critical thinking ability and use the literary knowledge/ texts in the teaching of English language
- 7. Develop an international consciousness through dealing with the concept of transnationalism in literature and demonstrate advanced level awareness and skills of translation
- 8. Synthesise the knowledge of designing research, reviewing literature, sampling, reporting and conduct educational research independently
- 9. Master classroom management skills including how to deliver content, use teaching aids, lead a discussion, handle questions and answers, obtain feedback and so on
- 10. Realise the ethical dimension in research, teaching and learning
- 11. Critically question some fundamental beliefs of ELT while developing an awareness of the connections between English language pedagogy and imperialism, colonialism, social justice etc.
